GENERAL RECYCLING GUIDE

These materials are generally accepted by all curbside or traditional recycling programs

RECYCLABLE ITEMS

(must be clean, dry, and grease free)

- **Glass -** bottles and jars of all colors
- **Metal -** aluminum, steel, tin, bimetal cans
- Paper newspaper, office paper, junk mail, magazines, paper board
- Plastic bottles, jars, jugs
- Corrugated cardboard flattened

HELPFUL RECYCLING TIPS

Glass - remove and dispose of lids in trash. No need to remove labels. Do NOT include light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window or auto glass in bin.

Metal - aluminum and steel cans only. Do NOT include metal hangers, cooking pots and pans or other scrap metal such as foil and pie plates in bin.

Paper - Do NOT put paper in plastic bags or put out when rain is likely.

Plastic - Do NOT put plastic bags in bin. Reuse or take to a local grocer that offers to recycle them. For more info visit **www.abagslife.com**

- Compost Sale


Beaver County Recycling Center

is a full-service center capable of prossessing a multitude of traditional and specialty materials. The center is located in Bradys Run Park at 121 BRADYS RUN RD., BEAVER FALLS, PA 15010 and is open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. and the first and third Saturday of every month from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m.

Recyclable materials include:

- Corrugated cardboard
- E-waste
- Glass food jars and beverage containers
- Metal food and beverage containers
- Mixed paper
- Plastic bottles (1-2-3-4-5-6)
- Polystyrene
- Scrap Metal
- Textiles/Fibers
- Yard Waste





ELECTRONICS

The Beaver County Recycling Center is open to Beaver County residents only and accepts the following e-waste for a fee:

- cell phones
- computers
- copier machines
- fax machines
- hard drives
- ink cartridges
- keyboards
- microwaves
- printers
- radios
- small appliances
- televisions
- VCR/DVD players

E-waste is serious because...

It's the law

The Pennsylvania Covered Devices Recycling Act (CDRA) states that electronics such as televisions, computers, and tablets — and computer accessories such as keyboards and laptops — are prohibited from landfills or incinerators and must be recycled at approved facilities.

It can be deadly

Electronics waste, or "e-waste," contains toxic materials including:

- lead (neurotoxin)
- cadmium and beryllium (carcinogens)
- **brominated flame retardants** (endocrine disruptor)
- mercury (neurotoxin and nephrotoxin)

If electronics are not recycled properly, toxins can leach into groundwater or be released into the air. Certification assures these potentially hazardous products aren't sent overseas where substandard conditions may lead to greater negative environmental and health impacts.





HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

Each Pennsylvanian produces an average of 4 pounds of chemical waste every year. Combined that's 25,000 tons annually!

Common household chemicals include paints, cleaners, automotive fluids, garden chemicals and more. These products can be identified as toxic by label markings such as "caution," "poison," or "flammable." It is UNSAFE to pour these household chemicals down a drain or to discard them with curbside trash as toxins may contaminate groundwater and local waterways used for drinking.

Beaver County Recycling Center accepts and responsibly recycles:

- anti-freeze
- motor oil
- fluorescent light bulbs
- transmission fluid
- hydraulic oil

HHW Disposal Resources

Below are other options for responsibly disposing of household hazardous waste

- Automotive fluids are accepted at many auto body shops
- **Latex-based paints** dry out and place with regular trash

OTHER SPECIALTY MATERIALS

Beaver County Recycling Center also provides recycling options for the following other specialty materials:

- **batteries -** automotive, rechargeable
- pallets
- polystyrene packaging (no food containers or packaging peanuts)
- scrap metal

- scrap metal scrap yards and dealers
